LATEST DIRECTIVE RELATED TO FULL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER (FMCO) 3.0 (From June 4th to June 14th 2021)

As we are all aware, the University has been placed under the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) since May 21st 2021 until June 3rd 2021. As the current situation shows a declining trend of Covid-19 cases on campus, the Kulai District Health Office (PKD) has agreed that the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) ends on 3rd June 2021.

Nonetheless, following the announcement on the implementation of Full Movement Control Order (FMCO) nationwide for a period of 14 (fourteen) days starting June 1st until June 14th 2021, the University through its *Emergency Response Team (ERT)* main committee meeting on June 1st 2021 has decided on the operations of Universiti Teknologi Malaysia effective **June 4th until June 14th 2021**. Apart from complying with the implementation of the nationwide FMCO, the decision on the dates has taken into consideration the post-EMCO transition period for the UTM Johor Bahru campus.

The details of the operations of the University are as listed below:

STUDENT MOVEMENT ORDER

- (i) All students are **NOT ALLOWED** to enter/exit the campus effective June 4th until June 14th, 2021. For **UTMKL** the effective date is from June 1st until June 14th, 2021.
- (ii) All students residing in the campus are **ALLOWED** to move within the University compound, except for students who are placed under the quarantine order at Blocks S46/S47.
- (iii) Food aid will be continued for students placed under the guarantine order at Blocks S46/S47.
- (iv) Students undergoing isolation are not allowed to go out of the building, and so food delivery is **ALLOWED**.

- (v) In cases where students must exit the campus for an emergency reason, an application can be submitted to the respective college principal, who will subsequently forward the application for review to the Director of University Health Centre (PKU) for cases involving health issues or to the Director of University Security Division for other matters.
- (vi) All students residing in the campus are **ALLOWED** to involve in an individual sport activity following the SOP regulated by the National Security Council (MKN).
- (vii) All students residing in the campus are **NOT ALLOWED** to participate in any form of face-to-face group discussions, meetings and gatherings. Communication for any group interaction must be through the online platform.
- (viii) Movement of all students residing outside the campus must follow the SOPs set by MKN and students are **NOT ALLOWED** to enter the campus.

BUSINESS OUTLET FACILITIES INSIDE THE CAMPUS

- (i) Cafeterias and mini marts are **ALLOWED** to operate from 8 am to 8 pm only.
- (ii) For cafeterias, only packed food is **ALLOWED**.
- (iii) Food Delivery and panda mart are **ALLOWED** until 8 pm only.
- (iv) Students with family should get grocery supply/ cooking gas through online/delivery services or from mini marts operating inside the campus.
- (v) Students who need fuel for their vehicle can get the supply through the service provided by the UTM Fleet Workshop, located at block F53A. Supply is limited of 2 litres for motorcycles and 10 litres for cars.
- (vi) Mobile clinic service is ended; all health issues should be referred to the University Health Centre (PKU).
- (vii) Parents or next of kin who wish to deliver any food or other necessity to their children or dependents inside the campus are allowed to do so through **delivery services**.

The Operations Room (Bilik Gerakan) at Rumah Alumni will continue to be in operation until further notice. Therefore, all contributions/donation for students residing in the campus can be directly sent to the Operations Room at Rumah Alumni for distribution purposes.
